



NOTICE OF ENACTMENT OF LAND LAWS

TO : All Members, Magnetawan First Nation

RE : Four Land Laws enacted by the Council of Magnetawan First Nation

Magnetawan First Nation has broad authority to manage and protect its reserve lands pursuant to the *Framework Agreement on First Nation Land Management*, the *First Nations Land Management Act* and the *Magnetawan First Nation Land Code*. This authority includes the jurisdiction to pass land laws setting out the principles, rules and administrative structures that apply to Magnetawan First Nation lands.

Pursuant to this authority and in accordance with the procedures set out within the *Magnetawan First Nation Land Code*, the Council of Magnetawan First Nation have, following community consultation and ratification by the eligible voters, enacted four Land Laws:

1. Land Law 2017/18-001 THE MAGNETAWAN FIRST NATION LAND REGISTER, enacted 01 October 2017: establishes the Magnetawan Land Laws Register and provides for the recording and registration of Land Laws enacted under the *Magnetawan First Nation Land Code*.
2. Land Law 2017/18-002 FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE MAGNETAWAN FIRST NATION LAND CODE, enacted 01 October 2017: amends the *Magnetawan First Nation Land Code*.
3. Land Law 2017/18-003 ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND PERMITTING FOR THE HIWLP TRANSMISSION LAND LINE, enacted 01 October 2017: establishes an environmental assessment, protection, permitting and enforcement regime for the proposed 230 kV Henvey Inlet Wind LP Transmission Line to be constructed and operated within a leasehold parcel of Magnetawan First Nation Reserve No. 1 land.
4. Land Law 2017/18-004 SPECIAL LEASE TERMS FOR THE HIWLP TRANSMISSION LINE LEASE, enacted 01 October 2017: approves certain special terms for the proposed lease of Magnetawan First Nation Reserve No. 1 land to be created for the Henvey Inlet Wind LP Transmission Line.
